But in the last term the following achievements took place:

- First three schools in Sheffield
- First two schools in Doncaster
- First school in North Lincolnshire
- First school in Lancashire
- First school in Bolton
- First school in Reading
- First school in Harrow

Plus in the last week the first school in Walsall has achieved!
